

CITY OF BELLEVUE, KENTUCKY

ORDINANCE NO. 2007-02-04

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THAT THE OFFER OF DEDICATION OF THE STREET KNOWN AS LAFAYETTE AVENUE IN THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY, WOULD BE BENEFICIAL TO THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND SUITABLE FOR ACCEPTANCE BY THE CITY AND ACCEPTING SAID PUBLIC WAY FOR PURPOSES OF PUBLIC TRAVEL AND MAINTENANCE BY THE CITY AS DEPICTED ON THE PLATS ATTACHED HERETO.

WHEREAS, Ackermann Enterprises, Inc. submitted Stage I and Stage II Development Plans to City Council that included the widening of Lafayette Avenue from Fairfield Avenue north to Eden Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue approved the Stage I and Stage II Development Plans that included the widening of Lafayette Avenue from Fairfield Avenue north to Eden Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Ackermann Enterprises, Inc. has petitioned the City of Bellevue to dedicate that portion of the street known as Lafayette Avenue north to Eden Avenue as a public way as depicted on the plats marked Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the City's engineer has inspected that portion of the street known as Lafayette Avenue north to Eden Avenue as depicted on the plats marked Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto and found the street was constructed in accordance with the City's subdivision regulations; and

WHEREAS, the proposed dedication by owner and acceptance by City of Bellevue would be beneficial to the public interest and suitable for public travel and acceptance by the City of Bellevue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

That the offer of dedication of the portion of the street known as Lafayette Avenue north to Eden Avenue depicted on the plats marked Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto in the City of Bellevue, Campbell County, Kentucky, would be beneficial to the public interest and suitable for acceptance by the City, and that such street is hereby accepted for purposes of public travel and maintenance.

SECTION 2

This ordinance shall be effective upon its approval, adoption and publication according to law.
