ORDINANCE 2011 – 02 – 02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 93-8-1 TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION TO REQUIRE UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE, MATTRESSES, PILLOWS, CUSHIONS, BOX SPRINGS AND SIMILAR ITEMS TO BE ENCAPSULATED IN PLASTIC BEFORE PLACEMENT ALONG THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY FOR DISPOSAL.

WHEREAS, it is within the powers of the City to protect residents from infestations by all forms of natural vermin;

WHEREAS, the City is responsible for the garbage franchise and collection within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has identified a necessity to prevent the spread of vermin from infested rubbish and household items placed on the public right away for disposal.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY:

That Ordinance 93-8-1 is amended to add the following new section and language.

SECTION ONE

Section 5. Garbage collection containers

- (A) Each owner and/or tenant of private property shall comply with the following minimum requirements in the disposal of garbage.
- (B) Each residential, industrial, institutional and/or commercial establishment, or person having refuse, shall provide or be provided approved refuse therein. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to provide containers to their tenants.
- (C) Containers shall be supplied at all multi-family housing units by every property owner. A minimum of one (1) garbage can should be provided for every two (2) persons in each household in each multi-family structure.

(D) Owners and/or their tenants shall encapsulate and securely wrap in plastic any upholstered furniture, mattresses, pillows, cushions, box springs and similar items placed out for collection or otherwise placed in the public right of way.

SECTION TWO

This ordinance may be read and published in Summary.

SECTION THREE

This ordinance shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk, recorded, published, and shall be in effect at the earliest time provided by law.
