Additional Items:

1. Land Slippage Meeting and Follow-up

A meeting was hosted by the Campbell County Conservation District to provide information regarding the land slippages in our area. The meeting was well attended. One speaker indicated that there was money available for Hazard Mitigation Grants thru FEMA. The last word from the Kentucky Department of Emergency Management (KyDEM) was that they were going to look into the matter.

2. Street Resurfacing – Ward, Colfax, Union

The 2010-11 Project is nearing completion. All streets have been paved and curbs redone where necessary. The final restoration phase is underway. We have received a few complaints about the pavement process. One that is still open deals with the curb depth that was poured v. what was required in the bid specs. We will start the bid process for the 2011-2012 projects in the next few weeks.

3. 145 Washington

An applicant has submitted a request for a Rental Conversion grant for 145 Washington. Using the guidelines set forth in the program, the conversion project is eligible for \$5,000. Because the project is a zoning district that can allow a multifamily residence, a deed restriction will be required for the property that will restrict the property to single family unless approved by City Council.

4. Southbank Shuttle

The Shuttle will continue to run through Bellevue. Campbell County Fiscal Court accepted our Resolution and listened to testimony by staff and shuttle riders as to the importance of public transportation to the region. In the end, Campbell County Fiscal Court increased its funding to TANK so that Southbank Shuttle services can continue through Bellevue
