

COUNCIL CHAMBER CITY OF BELLEVUE, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL APRIL 13, 2011

Board of Council met in regular session on the above date at 7:00 p.m. with the following members answering roll call:

MEMBERS: Rich, Wiethorn, Guidugli, Ratterman, Almoslechner, and Olliges. Mayor Edward Riehl presiding.

The meeting was opened with a prayer and pledge to the flag.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Ratterman that the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council March 9, 2011 are accepted as received. Motion carried.

FOR THE RECORD: Correspondence from Dot Murphy received and filed.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Ratterman that the correspondence from Dot Murphy indicating she will no longer be involved with the Bellevue Dayton Memorial Day Parade be accepted with deep regrets and appreciation for her service. Motion carried.

FOR THE RECORD: City Council will honor Dot Murphy with a proclamation at the May meeting of Council.

Grant money has been obtained for new playground equipment at Grandview.

School Board is reviewing bids for renovation at the High School as well as a wellness center for Ben Flora Gymnasium.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Wiethorn that the request for a block party in the 400 block of Foote be approved pending notification to safety departments for June 4, 2011. Motion carried.

FOR THE RECORD: Police Officer Jon McClain received a promotion after completing his probationary period. Chief Cole commended Officer McClain for his service during his probationary period.

FOR THE RECORD: Mayor Riehl advised Council that there are pending changes to the HOME Consortium due to funding cuts, more details will be provided at the May meeting of Council.

FOR THE RECORD: Assistant City Administrator Jody Robinson reported on the following:

City Wide Yard Sale – Saturday June 4 beginning at 8 am.

FOR THE RECORD: Council Member Guidugli requested that the photos of the businesses on Fairfield be included in “What’s happening on Fairfield Avenue” section of Ms. Robinson’s report.

FOR THE RECORD: Chief Cole reported that his dog “Bert” will be on WCPO Crime Stoppers Auction tonight – people can bid on a right to walk Bert in the annual Memorial Day parade – money raised will benefit Crime Stoppers.

FOR THE RECORD: City Administrator Spoelker requested Council consideration for a request from the Bellevue Neighborhood Association for permission to use the land between Ward and Foote for a community garden. The area currently has a compost bin on site.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Almoslechner that the City enter into a lease agreement with the Bellevue Neighborhood Association for a Community Garden in the area between Ward and Foote. Motion carried.

FOR THE RECORD: Attorney Rick Robinson filled in for City Attorney Paul Alley.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Ratterman that Ordinance 2011-04-01 an Ordinance annexing to the City of Bellevue, unincorporated area of 1.3558 acres, more or less, lying adjacent and contiguous to the exiting City limits of the City of Bellevue, Campbell County, Kentucky be read for a first time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Rich that Ordinance 2011-04-01 pass the first reading. VOTE: Yes 6 No 0. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Guidugli that Ordinance 2011-04-02 an Ordinance annexing to the City of Bellevue, unincorporated area of 4.2 acres, more or less, lying adjacent and contiguous to the existing city limits of the City of Bellevue, Campbell County, Kentucky be read for a first time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Ratterman seconded by Wiethorn that Ordinance 2011-04-02 pass the first reading. VOTE: Yes 6 No 0. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Ratterman that Ordinance 2011-04-03 prohibiting the sale and use of certain fireworks within the City of Bellevue, Campbell County, Kentucky be read for a first time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Guidugli that Ordinance 2011-04-03 pass the first reading. VOTE: Yes 6 No 0. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Wiethorn seconded by Guidugli that Order 2011-04-01 authorizing and directing Mayor Riehl to enter into an agreement with Rosey's Lawn and Landscape in the amount of \$13,930.00 be adopted as read. Motion carried.
