MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL APRIL 10, 2013

Board of Council met in regular session on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The following members answered roll call:

The meeting was opened with a prayer and pledge to the flag.

MOTION: By Olliges seconded by Helton to excuse Council Member Poynter. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Rich seconded by Almoslechner that the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council March 13, 2013 are accepted as received. Motion carried.

Due to a scheduling conflict Member Guidugli will speak on behalf of Mayor Riehl at the Arbor Day celebration April 27. Celebration will begin at 10 am at Ward and Center Street.

Park at Center and Ward will be officially dedicated sometime in May – game tables have been ordered.

Insurance received on 2006 Dodge Dakota – funds will be used to pay off remaining debt on 2010 Ford F-150 and to finance new police vehicle.

Campbell County Cooperative Extension Service will be available for a tree planting demonstration during the Arbor Day Event held at Center and Ward Park on April 27. Each of the three trees planted will be dedicated to each Bellevue school with a plaque.

City received a grant from the Conservation District in the amount of \$950.00 - grant funds will be used to plant rose bushes at Bellevue Beach Park.

City received Tree City USA for 11th year in a row.

Off Street Parking Grant is on target with approximately 65% of its appropriated funding utilized.

Rental Conversion Grant request have slowed up. Member Guidugli noted that Bellevue has a 67.1% home ownership percentage which indicates that the program has worked.
