**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF BELLEVUE SUPPORT FOR
NAMING THE BEACH PARK NEIGHBORHOOD**

WHEREAS, Bellevue City Council was asked on July 13, 2016 to consider naming the neighborhood adjacent to the Thomas J. Weithorn Memorial Beach Park the “Beach Park Neighborhood”; and

WHEREAS, By naming the Beach Park neighborhood will provide an identity that will help elevate the neighborhood through its history, community pride, and collaboration while stimulating interest, beach themed aesthetic treatments, and investment; and

WHEREAS, The Beach Park neighborhood would have the boundaries of the Ohio River on the north, Lafayette Avenue to the west, Fairfield Avenue to the north, and O’Fallon Avenue to the east; and

WHEREAS, The name is based on the park that recognized the Queen City Beach with sandy white beaches opened in the spring of 1902 and the pavilion and the bathhouse were completed in 1903 and operated until sometime in the 1920s; and

WHEREAS, The Beach Park lost its popularity due to the change in the Ohio River caused by the lock and dam system started in the mid-1950’s and completed in 1964.

THEREFORE, Let it be resolved that the Bellevue City Council supports the naming of the neighborhood bound by the Ohio River, Lafayette Avenue, Fairfield Avenue, and O’Fallon Avenue as the Beach Park Neighborhood.
