

COUNCIL CHAMBER CITY OF BELLEVUE, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL SEPTEMBER 29, 2016

Board of Council met in special session on the above date at 7:50 p.m. The following members answered roll call:

MEMBERS: Guidugli, Tatum, Poynter and Slater. Mayor Edward Riehl presiding.

FOR THE RECORD: Mayor Riehl stated this meeting is considered a Special Meeting of Council only items on the agenda will be addressed.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Tatum that Council Members Olliges and Salzman be excused. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Tatum that Ordinance 2016-09-07 levying and ad valorem tax rate for the fiscal period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 on all property located in the City of Bellevue, Kentucky. Levying an ad valorem tax rate and establishing the rates therefore and adopting the Campbell County Property Valuation Administrator's assessment on said property and providing for a tax lien against all taxable property in the City of Bellevue to secure the payment of said taxes be read for a first time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Tatum that Ordinance 2016-09-07 pass the first reading. VOTE: Yes 2 No 2. FOR THE RECORD THE DISSENTING VOTES WERE CAST BY MEMBERS SLATER AND POYNTER. FOR THE RECORD MAYOR RIEHL CAST THE TIE BREAKING VOTE IN THE AFFIRMATIVE. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Slater that Ordinance 2016-09-06 amending Chapter 50 of the City of Bellevue Code of Ordinances relating to waste collection, establishing regulations and a service fee; and amending the following sections of Ordinance 95-6-3 and amending Ordinance 2007-10-01 be reading for a first time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Tatum that Ordinance 2016-09-06 pass the first reading. VOTE: Yes 4 No 0. FOR THE RECORD: Member Slater asked if the issues with the condos on Truman were addressed – Still working on per Administrator Spoelker. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Slater that Resolution 2016-09-01 to support construction of the Bellevue Historic Pedestrian Bridge Restoration and O' Fallon Park Trail with Transportation Alternative Program Financing be read. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Slater that Resolution 2016-09-01 be adopted as read. FOR THE RECORD: Member Poynter asked what is the cost to the City associated with this – per Assistant Administrator Jody Robinson, this will not be in the current fiscal year budget and cost is unknown at this time. Member Poynter asked if plans are on paper for this – yes.

MOTION: By Tatum seconded by Guidugli to allow for a closure of Washington at Fairfield for Taste of Bellevue on Friday, November 4<sup>th</sup>. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Tatum seconded by Guidugli that the above event be referred to as a City Event for purposes of Microbrewery participation. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Slater to adjourn at 8:10 pm. Motion carried.
