

COUNCIL CHAMBER CITY OF BELLEVUE, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL JUNE 28, 2018

Board of Council met in special session on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The following members answered roll call:

MEMBERS: Brun, Rich, Guidugli, Poynter, Slater and Salzman. Mayor Edward Riehl presiding.

MOTION: By Brun seconded by Guidugli that Ordinance 2018-06-01 amending the annual budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 by estimating revenues and appropriating funds for the operation of city government be read for a second time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Brun seconded by Salzman that Ordinance 2018-06-01 pass the second reading. VOTE: Yes 4 No 2. FOR THE RECORD THE DISSENTING VOTES WERE CAST BY MEMBERS POYNTER AND SLATER. THE ORDINANCE BECAME LAW.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Poynter expressed objection to amending the budget as a yearend wrap up – should be done when the expense occurs. Member Brun asked where is this in State law – Administrator Spoelker will research.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Brun that Ordinance 2018-06-02 adopting the annual budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019 by estimating revenues and appropriating funds for the operation of city government be read for a second time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Brun that Ordinance 2018-06-02 pass the second reading. VOTE: Yes 4 No 2 FOR THE RECORD THE DISSENTING VOTES WERE CAST BY MEMBER POYNTER AND SLATER. Motion carried. THE ORDINANCE BECAME LAW.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Poynter voiced his objection to the City always taking the 4% property tax increase and \$30,000.00 budgeted for study for prioritization of road projects. Member Slater stated funds allocated for road study could be put to better use. Police and Public Services should be reporting road issues. Member Brun encouraged the need for professional opinion on roads.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Poynter expressed concerns for street maintenance. City should look at better drainage and crack sealing. Member Slater asked if the City still had a crack sealer – Administrator Spoelker will check into and see if operational.

FOR THE RECORD: Mayor Riehl will have staff research actual cost of engineering study on roads and bring back to Council.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Poynter that Ordinance 2018-06-03 levying and assessing ad valorem taxes for General Fund and Municipal purposes for fiscal year July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 of all Motor Vehicles assessed within the City and setting the tax rate at .385 per \$100.00 valuation be read for a second time. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Salzman seconded by Poynter that Ordinance 2018-06-03 pass the second reading. VOTE: Yes 5 No 1. FOR THE RECORD THE DISSENTING VOTE WAS CAST BY MEMBER SLATER. Motion carried. THE ORDINANCE BECAME LAW.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Slater stated his opposition to the Motor Vehicle tax – residents do not feel vehicles should be taxed.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Salzman that Ordinance 2018-06-04 updating the annual classification and compensation plan of the City of Bellevue be read for a second time. Motion carried.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Slater asked if all employees fell within the proposed range – yes.

MOTION: By Slater seconded by Poynter that Ordinance 2018-06-04 pass the second reading. VOTE: Yes 6 No 0. Motion carried. THE ORDINANCE BECAME LAW.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Salzman noted the position of Zoning Administrator was still included in pay ranges.

MOTION: By Guidugli seconded by Slater to adjourn at 7:30 pm. Motion carried.
