

**CITY OF BELLEVUE
ORDINANCE NO. 2019-08-02**

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTER IN THE CITY OF BELLEVUE; AND FURTHER DIRECTING THE CITY OF BELLEVUE TO APPLY FOR AN ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTER LICENSE FROM THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL; AND FURTHER ESTABLISHING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSEE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE COMMON AREAS OF THE ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTER.

WHEREAS, KRS 243.030(21) authorizes the issuance of an Entertainment Destination Center (EDC) License by the Kentucky Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the Fairfield Avenue Historic District and other attractions, the creation of an EDC in the designated area as described herein certain boundaries of the City will aid in the economic growth of tourism in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City seeks to create an EDC on Fairfield Avenue for which it shall obtain a license from the Kentucky Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control; and

WHEREAS, the City further seeks to establish the requirements for a licensee to sell alcoholic beverages within the common areas of the EDC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new Article shall be created in Chapter ____ of the Bellevue Municipal Code to state as follows:

The geographical boundaries of the Entertainment Destination Center (EDC) in the City of Bellevue lie within and adjacent to the following description:
The Entertainment Destination Center is a geographic area that is bordered on the North by the North side of, and including, Fairfield Avenue and its sidewalks, on the South, by the South side of, and including Fairfield Avenue and its sidewalks, on the East by O'Fallon Avenue and on the West by Riviera Drive.

Section 2. A new Section shall be created in Chapter ____ of the Bellevue Municipal Code to state as follows:

(a) The City of Bellevue shall apply for an EDC license.

(b) A business that is located within the EDC that sells alcoholic beverages shall hold the necessary alcoholic beverage license or licenses for its premises.

(d) During days and times designated by the City, patrons may leave the premises of businesses located in the EDC that sell alcoholic beverages with alcoholic beverage drinks and consume those drinks in any entertainment destination center common area or at other licensed premises within the EDC if permitted by said business, if the City:

(1) Possesses or owns the common area;

(2) Provides adequate security for the common area;

(3) Ensures that the public streets are controlled in a manner that promotes public safety and pedestrian protection from vehicular traffic;

(4) Prohibits patrons from taking alcoholic beverages outside the physical boundaries of the entertainment destination center;

(5) Requires any drinks that are removed from the licensed premises within the EDC shall be in a particular type and/or style of cup as determined by the City.

(e) The City shall have the authority to draft, create and enforce further regulations within the EDC, by executive order, and does not require an additional or amended ordinance.

INTRODUCED AND PUBLICLY READ ON FIRST READING, this the 14th day of August, 2019.

This Ordinance shall be effective when read, passed and advertised according to law.
