MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL JULY 13, 2022

Board of Council met in regular session on the above date at 7:00 p.m. The following answered roll call:

MEMBERS Guidugli, Witte, Fisher, Hogan, Kruse and Salzman. Mayor Charlie Cleves presiding.

MOTION By Kruse seconded by Hogan that the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council June 8, 2022 be accepted as received. Motion carried.

FOR THE RECORD: Member Fisher provided a written report on the Bellevue Parks Resident Feedback. Council Members Salzman, Hogan and Fisher elicited community feedback on the Bellevue parks system – what should be maintained, upgraded and future visions for the parks. An online survey, focus group of Middle and High School Students, and an in-person feedback session with over 250 responses.

Highlights of the feedback included:

Comfort and cooling areas – including more shaded areas, water fountains, splash parks and park bench swings.

Safety – Fencing for Brun Park and upgrading playground surfaces. Mulch replaced and a new surface suggested.

Playground Equipment – natural playscape elements, referencing Summit Park in Blue Ash and Cincinnati Smale Park. Group suggested more swings; traditional, ADA accessible as well as tire swings, multi-user swings, zip lines, merry go rounds, areas to climb.

Administrator Warnock expressed appreciation for the work that went into this for the future of the parks. Special thanks to Council Members Fisher, Salzman and Hogan for their work.

MOTION By Fisher seconded by Kruse that the Bellevue Parks Residents Feedback report be used as guidance for the planning of the parks. Motion carried.
