**RESOLUTION NO. 2021-10-01**

**FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION**

**LET IT BE KNOWN TO ALL PERSONS OF BELLEVUE**, Kentucky that discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing or in the provision of brokerage services because of race, color, religion, sex or nation origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the 1968 Civil Rights Act (Federal Fair Housing Law).

It is the policy of **THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, KENTUCKY** to implement programs to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The Fair Hosing Amendments Act of 1988 expanded coverage to include disabled persons and families with children and HUD 2012 regulations expanded coverage to sexual orientation or gender identity. Therefore, the City does hereby pass the following Resolution.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that acting within the available resources the City will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, disability or familial status to seek equity under Federal and state laws by filing a complaint with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity, Compliance Division;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the City shall publicize this Resolution and through said efforts shall encourage owners of real estate, developers and builders to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Law and amendments and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT SAID PROGRAM** will include: (1) printing and publicizing of this policy and other applicable fair housing information through local media and community contacts; (2) distribution of posters, flyers, and any other means that will bring attention of those affected, the knowledge of their respective responsibilities and rights concerning equal opportunity in housing; and (3) prepare and analysis of impediments to fair housing choice and actions to mitigate such impediments.

This resolution shall take effect 10/13/2021.
