MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL OCTOBER 9, 2024

Board of Council met in regular session on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Charlie Cleves called the meeting to order. Mayor Cleves asked everyone to stay standing for a moment of silence in remembrance of 9/11. The following answered roll call:

FOR THE RECORD: Public Services Foreman Rick Mallery was absent. Report is provided in the packet.

FOR THE RECORD: City Administrator Frank Warnock reported on the following:

Street resurfacing is set to begin 10/28.

There is an order on tonight's agenda for property transfer to the Bellevue School System.

Legislation soon to be considered for an interlocal agreement with Campbell County Police and Dayton Police Departments for a Police Social Worker. This will be funded with the opioid settlement funds the City has received.

Publicly thank Mayor Cleves for all his hard work he has put in towards the city parks and the city in general.

FOR THE RECORD: Arland Jackson, resident, asked questions about the city parks and more specifically about the beach park.

MOTION: By Salzman seconded by Guidugli that Ordinance § 2024-09-01 an ordinance levying ad valorem tax rate for the fiscal period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. VOTE: Yes 6 No 0. Motion carried. THE ORDINANCE BECAME LAW.

FOR THE RECORD: City Attorney Dave Fessler read Ordinance § 2024-10-01 an ordinance amending the City of Bellevue zoning ordinance related to definitions.

FOR THE RECORD: City Attorney Dave Fessler read Ordinance § 2024-10-02 an ordinance amending the City of Bellevue zoning ordinance, subdivision regulations, and historic preservation ordinance related to civil penalties.

MOTION: By Kruse seconded by Salzman that Order 2024-10-01 an order authorizing the application of a zoning text amendment review related to the regulation of medical cannabis in the City of Bellevue. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Kruse seconded by Fisher to amend Order 2024-10-02 to include Grandview. By Kruse seconded by Almoslechner that Order 2024-10-02 an order finding and declaring City of Bellevue real property as surplus and authorizing its disposition to the Board of Education of Bellevue, Kentucky. Motion carried.

MOTION: By Fisher seconded by Salzman to amend Order 2024-10-03 to remove finance department and add City Clerk/Treasurer. By Kruse seconded by Fisher that Order 2024-10-03 an order authorizing the implementation of the Bellevue UG Federal Grant written procedures as a standard of procedures when working with state and federal grant dollars. Motions carried.

FOR THE RECORD: Council member Kruse stated Art in the Park had a great turnout.

FOR THE RECORD: Council member Guidugli said he's been received a lot of concerns on the lack of street sweeping. Believes the city should look into contracting for this service, similar to other cities.

MOTION: By Kruse seconded by Almoslechner to adjourn at 7:43 p.m. Motion Carried.
