### **I. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS**

Mayor Charlie Cleves called the session to order at 9am and welcomed councilmembers, staff, and the public. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss priorities and goals for the City of Bellevue in 2026. Mayor Cleves looked back at all the things that happened over the past year and proposed his goals for 2026 including breaking ground on the Harbor Green Development, Beach Park Expansion, finish out grants, and get a kayak ramp grant.

### **II. REVIEW OF 2025 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

City Administrator Frank Warnock and department heads briefly reviewed key accomplishments from 2025, including infrastructure improvements, community initiatives, and operational updates. ### **III. STRATEGIC PRIORITIES FOR 2026**

Council and staff discussed priority areas for 2026 including infrastructure, economic development, public safety, community engagement, and parks and recreation. Mr. Warnock went over multiples “wish list” initiatives to tackle in the coming year. Please refer to the 2026 Visioning Session Report for additional information

### **IV. COUNCIL VISIONING & IDEAS**

Councilmembers Shauna Kruse, Mike Almoslechner, Chasity Bothman, Kara Harp, Jack Ondeck, and Steve Guidugli submitted and/or participated in open discussions regarding priorities they would like to see addressed during the 2026 calendar year and looking ahead to 2027 goals.

Topics discussed included pedestrian safety and walkability, historic preservation, enforcement and ordinance updates, greenspace improvements, street paving, relationships with city organizations, businesses, and neighboring communities, budget considerations, updates to the city building, short-term rental regulations, Flock cameras, grant funding for projects, positioning

Bellevue as a destination city, communications and transparency, public art, volunteer committees, educational opportunities for councilmembers, and commercial property development.

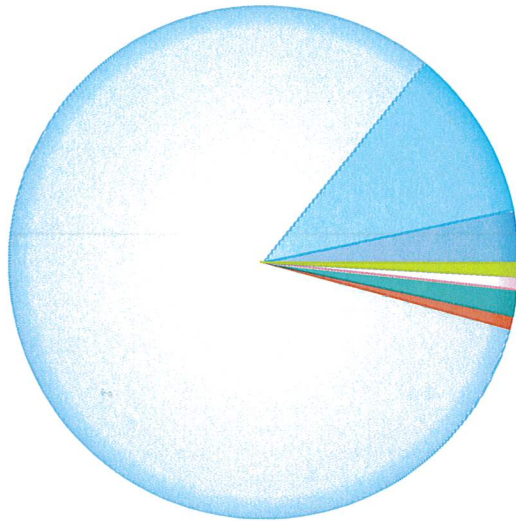

## PROJECT UPDATES FROM CITY ENGINEER

PROJECT	STATUS
FEMA SLIDE	Everything has been submitted to KYEM for project closeout.
DONNERMEYER DRIVE	PRIME is performing a final internal plan review. Updated plans will be sent to City for a final review and to Maggie at KYTC for the final environmental approval. PRIME sent me a plan set that has the disturb limits finalized. I have begun working on getting the consent and release forms signed and have contact information for all of the owners.
Covert Run	We only need the consent and release form from 650 Covert Run because 3 cars stack up from the back of the driveway up to the edge of pavement. PRIME is checking to see if the design can be updated to stay off this property all together. Palmer has started on the environmental process and Nikki is working on the stormwater component. PRIME to send plans to review ASAP.
Riverfront Commons Multi-Use Path	PRIME is updating the path design. Lochner is going to do the Environmental. I have asked PRIME to provide an estimated timeline on when the plans will be updated and ready for review. We met with the development team on 1/27 with PRIME AE to coordinate the path design with the updated site layout. This includes trying to accommodate the potential need for the ladder truck to access the river side of the development. The development team provided the design files for PRIME to use to help update the layout of the path.
Pedestrian Bridge	Sam has the plan for tree clearing in motion. All plan comments we received from CSX and KYTC have been addressed and approved. We are waiting on a construction agreement from CSX and final approval from KYTC. Everything has been submitted. The environmental has been approved by KYTC already. We will hold a pre-bid meeting to go over project details with the potential contractors.
Lincoln Road Sidewalk	KYTC has said the project will receive construction authorization within the next couple of weeks.
Annual Resurfacing	Eaton did not get all the resurfacing work they were scoped to do before the asphalt plants shut down for the winter. They have agreed to do the full fix for the driveways on Harrison to help make up for them not getting everything done. We are also reviewing the PCI list to see if there are other roads we want to add to their scope when they come back in the spring.
Benke Sidewalk	We met with PRIME to go over the details on the project so that design can continue. PRIME to coordinate with Mike Jones with KYTC in Frankfort to see how environmental process will be handled.
Fairfield Ave Sidewalk	Lochner has begun their environmental process. PRIME is looking into potentially extending the sidewalk in front of the Bellevue Vets back 6 inches to get 4' of clearance around each of the utility poles.
400 Taylor	Survey is complete and we have started on the design.

**AN ORDER APPROVING A FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN CINCY BIKE SHARE, INC. D/B/A RED BIKE AND THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, KENTUCKY, FOR OPERATIONAL SUPPORT OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS.**

**WHEREAS**, Cincy Bike Share, Inc. or doing business as Red Bike, is a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Ohio and recognized as a tax-exempt public charity pursuant to Sections 170(b)(1)(A), 501(c)(3), and 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code; and

**WHEREAS**, Red Bike provides regional bicycle-sharing services and programming that promote alternative transportation, public health, and community connectivity throughout the Greater Cincinnati region; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Bellevue desires to support the continued operation of Red Bike in alignment with its nonprofit charitable mission and for the benefit of residents of Bellevue and surrounding communities.

**BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, KENTUCKY, THAT:**

The Board of Council of the City of Bellevue hereby approves a Funding Agreement with Cincy Bike Share Inc. d/b/a Red Bike in the amount of \$5,000.00 per year for a period of three (3) years, for a total amount not to exceed \$15,000.00, for operational support consistent with Red Bike's mission as a nonprofit public charity.

Funds provided under this Agreement shall not be used to attempt to influence legislation or to participate in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office, and shall be used exclusively for activities conducted within the Greater Cincinnati region.

The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Funding Agreement on behalf of the City, subject to review and approval by the City Attorney. The Agreement shall commence upon the initial disbursement and shall continue for three (3) years thereafter, with annual payments made in accordance with the terms of the Agreement. A copy of the Agreement shall be kept on file in the Office of the City Clerk and is incorporated herein by reference as if fully rewritten.
