While 2024 was a difficult year due to staffing, our department continues to move in a positive direction. To combat our staffing issues we made adjustments to our pay scales to make our department more competitive, and to help retain the amazing officers we already have.

Over the last year, we made major advancements in our agencies operations. We upgraded our body cameras that utilized cloud storage. This makes it easier to retain videos and to share them with the prosecutors office. We upgraded our Tasers that were five to 15 years old to the newest models. Our contracts for both the cameras and the Tasers ensures we will always have the newest and most effective piece of equipment they offer.

We have also continued to upgrade our fleet of vehicles to ensure that our officers are always patrolling the streets in reliable vehicles that do not require a lot of down time due to excessive maintenance issues.




# OFFICER INITIATED CALLS

One report may contain multiple offenses.




Criminal offenses are reported to the FBI through the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). The offenses are separated in to two parts. Part One, crimes against persons or property; and Part Two, crimes against society, such as drug and alcohol offenses.


Non-criminal reports are completed for disputes, non criminal property damage, mental health, and other circumstances which do not reach the level of criminal activity.




Citations can have multiple charges listed. This results in more “charges” shown, than “citations”.



## TOP ROADWAY SPEEDING VIOLATIONS




## TOP ROADWAY DUI ARREST




# TRAFFIC DATA & ROADWAY CRASHES

## 155 VEHICLE COLLISIONS








## PARKING CITATION DISPOSITION



# RETIREMENT


